HAMPTON CONSERVATION COMMISSION Minutes of regular meeting of 27 October 2015

Additions to the agenda. None.

Old Business:

- 1. James Estabrooks' properties. Of the three parcels, the small one by Goodwin State Forest is being boughtm by a friend. The 36 acre one on Station Road is for sale and being looked at. The 5.4 acre piece on Old Town REAM Pound Rd. is still available to the Town as a gift.
- 2. Walktober walk. About 24 people showed up for the walk, cosponsored with the Historical Society, going from the Windy Hill end to KKNYNK Kimball Hill road and back. We also walked along the town property on Windt Hill to see some old foundations.
- 3. Current Open Space Grant Application. The Selectmen have received a notice frim the State of acceptance of our application to project 6.5 acres on Old Town Pound Road, adjacent to the 50 acre town piece at the top of the hill. Next there must be a town meeting to vote on the towns share of the purchase.

New Business:

- 1. 2016 Open Space Grant application. There are new grant rounds out now for 2016. Applications must be in by 02 February 2016. The commission discussed what, if any, parcels would be good candidates. It was agreed that the 51 acres along Little River off Hammond Hill road to the South would be one if it is available. This will be looked into. Other parcels on Parker road and West Fisk road were also discussed.
- 2. Green Energy Committee...recycling and composting. Chairman Thompson talked about attending a GEC meeting where they discussed recycling and composting, and the idea of HCC involvement. Our response was "like-warm" at best !
- 3. HES & HCC. Chairman Thompson brought up the idea of HCC possibly sponsoring, with some of our budget money, a class trip to view something such as recycling, or a local saw mill. Will be looked into...
