1. Call to Order

2. Audience for Citizens

3. Approval of Minutes: 4/12/17  
**Motion:** Sharon Wakely moved, Rachel Girshick seconded, to approve the minutes of 4/12/17. The motion passed unanimously.
4. Additions to the Agenda

5. Old Business
  - a. Recycling Guidebook  
The committee thanks Michael Quick for the layout. The book has been mailed to Hampton households. If not received, it may be obtained at town hall. The committee took copies to distribute at key locations such as the transfer station.
  - b. Film Series at Goodwin
    - i. July 6- "Breakthrough in Renewable Energy"  
The relatively short film (45 minutes) will be followed by discussion about energy efficiency and renewables.
    - ii. August 10- "Before the Flood"  
Rachel presented another topic, geoengineering, for which there is a five film series. Committee members will consider them for a winter film series.
    - iii. Outreach  
Committee members reported on progress in advertising the series and took flyers to post. Kate will prepare a press release.
  - c. "Electric Evolution, Renewable Solutions" - October 14; 10-2  
This Walktober event will include electric and hybrid cars, a presentation at noon about electric cars, a Home Energy Solutions company, LED light bulb give away and sales, Hampton elementary class and ECO club participation and food sales. Sharon reported that Premier Chevrolet will participate; members requested a Bolt. Sharon will also contact a Nissan dealer regarding a LEAF and hybrid car dealers. Kate will contact the Home Energy Solutions and light bulb exchange companies.

  - f. HES Indoor Lighting  
The installation of LED ballasts and bulbs has been completed. The variable frequency drives on the hot water circulation pumps will be installed this week. The timers for the outdoor lighting were reset to be on between 8pm and 6 am.

Hampton has 85 points. One hundred are needed for a new \$5,000 grant. Points are awarded after work about energy efficiency has been completed. Some of the committee's recent and upcoming work should add points to the total.
