

**Hampton IWWA Minutes**  
**Public Hearing – April 10, 2012**  
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The Public Hearing of the Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Agency was held on Tuesday, April 10, 2012 at the Town Office Building.

**Present for the Board:** Stanley Crawford, Chairman; Martin Mlyniec, Secretary; Muriel Miller; newly appointed member Dave Goodrich was introduced and seated.

**Absent:** Marlene Aulten and Perry Matchinis

**Staff and Others Present:** John Valente, Wetlands Enforcement Officer (7:35). Dayna McDermott-Arriola, Recording Secretary.

Chairman Crawford called the Public Hearing to order at 7:34 p.m.

Chairman Crawford announced the purpose of the Public Hearing:

To present revisions of the Town of Hampton, Connecticut Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Regulations:

- Public Act No.11-5 amends section 8-3(m), 8-26c(e), 8-26g(c), and 22a-42a(g) of the General Statutes of Connecticut. The revisions amend sections 7.10 and 11.6 of the Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Regulations and extend the deadlines that apply to certain inland wetlands agency permits.
- Public Act No. 11-184 amends section 22a-40 of the General Statutes of Connecticut. The revision amends section 4.1 and 4.2 of the Inlands Wetlands and Watercourses Regulations to add the withdrawal of water for fire emergency purposes as an as-of-right operation and to define the term “dry hydrant” and add the installation of dry hydrants for firefighting purposes as a non-regulated use.
- Public Act No. 10-85 amends section 47-42d of the General Statutes of Connecticut. The revisions amend section 7.11, 10.9 and 10.10 of the Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Regulations and affect permit applications relating to property subject to conservation or preservation restrictions.
